#### QUEZON CTY SCHOLARSHIP AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES 2021

The Scholarship and Youth Development Program is mandated to establish and maintain a system of scholarship grants which shall be available to deserving students, especially the underprivileged. The Program is categorized into: (1) scholarship for senior high school students; (2) scholarship for tertiary students; (3) scholarship for masters and doctorate students, and; (4) scholarship for vocational courses.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

The eligibility requirements for applicants across all scholarship categories are as follows:

- 1. Must be a Quezon City resident
- Must be enrolled/registered/accepted at a recognized educational institution at the time of scholarship application
- 3. Must meet the qualifications for the scholarship category being applied for

#### **QUALIFICATIONS**

#### I. SCHOLARSHIP FOR SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

- 1. Must be a graduate of a Quezon City public or private secondary school
- 2. Must be a Grade 10 completer with academic honors, overall Rank 1 to 10
- 3. Must maintain a General Weighted Average of at least 85%

#### II. SCHOLARSHIP FOR TERTIARY STUDENTS

#### Academic Scholarship

- Must be a graduate of a Quezon City public or private high school
- 2. Must be a senior high school completer with academic honors, overall Rank 1 to 10
- 3. Must maintain a General Weighted Average of at least 1.5 or its equivalent for Academic overall Rank 1 & 2 and at least 1.75 or its equivalent for Academic overall Rank 3 to 10

#### Economic Scholarship

- 1. Must be a graduate of a Quezon City public or private high school
- 2. Must apply with/maintain a General Weighted Average of at least 3.0 or its equivalent
- Must belong to any of the following groups: indigent families, displaced/relocated
  families, and vulnerable and marginalized sectors (PWDs, Kasambahays, ALS graduates,
  solo parents, children in conflict with the law, families of tricycle drivers and operators)

#### Athletic and Arts Scholarship

- 1. Must be a graduate of a Quezon City public or private high school
- Must be a recipient of a top individual award/recognition for sports and arts in the most recent school year/school term/playing season given by recognized institutions
- 3. Must apply with/maintain a General Weighted Average of at least 2.5 or its equivalent
- Must be active in the current school year/school term/playing season

#### CONDITIONS

The following conditions apply to all scholarship categories except Scholarship for Vocational Courses:

- 1. Scholars must meet/maintain the prescribed General Weighted Averages per scholarship category.
- 2. Scholars with INCOMPLETE grades will be allowed to apply for scholarship grant. However, release of grant will be put on hold pending grade completion within the school term the scholarship is applied for and provided that the prescribed General Weighted Average is met.
- 3. In any given semester, scholars with one DROPPED / FAILED subject will be allowed to apply for scholarship grant provided that the computed General Weighted Average of all subjects taken in the school term the scholarship is applied for meets the prescribed General Weighted Average.
- 4. Scholarship will be renewed every regular school term and will cover the prescribed or remaining number of terms/years as per the scholar's curriculum/program/degree requirements.
- 5. Scholars who are unable to meet the conditions for their scholarship have the option to apply in other categories and reapply in their original category, provided all qualifications are met.
- 6. Scholars must carry the full load prescribed (or allowable) in the curriculum.
- Scholars who shift courses or transfer schools may be allowed to apply for scholarship. However, the number of years/school terms covered by the scholarship based on the scholar's first scholarship application will remain.
- 8. Scholarship grants may only be claimed until the succeeding semester.

- 9. Scholars are encouraged to actively participate in community/special projects initiated by the City Government for the duration of his/her scholarship or as the need arises.
- 10. For Masters/Doctorate Students, theses/dissertations must incorporate policy/program proposals for the QC LGU and must be presented to the Scholarship Screening Committee. The Youth Development Office must be provided a copy of the scholars' policy/program proposals, at minimum, taking into consideration school policies on sharing of student theses and dissertations.
- 11. Masters/Doctorate students must render service for a year after degree completion, or otherwise be required to pay the scholarship amount equivalent to 1 year.
- 12. Only one member per family may avail a scholarship grant at any given time.
- 13. Scholars of other national or private organizations will be allowed to avail scholarship grant from the city provided that the scholar meets all conditions stated in his/her other scholarships. In which case, the city will only cover the additional amount needed by the scholar, not exceeding the allowable scholarship grant for the scholarship category being applied for. Scholars of other LGUs, however, are not eligible for scholarship grant.
- 14. Scholars who are from private schools or from schools outside Quezon City may be allowed to apply for scholarship grant provided they meet the qualifications for Economic Scholarship. However, additional proof of income, proof of residence, or other related documents may be required.
- 15. Additional documents may be required by the Youth Development Office, as the need arises.
- All other special cases will be raised to the Scholarship Screening Committee for appropriate action.

#### TERMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIP

The following constitute general grounds for termination of scholarship:

- 1. Non-fulfillment of conditions stated in the Scholarship Guidelines
- 2. Forging, falsification, and misrepresentation
- 3. Conviction of a crime and health conditions that render the scholar unfit to pursue studies during the term/school year applied for
- 4. Other causes as may be determined by the Youth Development Office

- 3. YDO conducts documentary evaluations and validations through interviews
- 4. Applicant receives notification that they qualify for the scholarship grant
- Applicant and parent/guardian sign the Scholarship Contract (for applicants below 18 years old)
- 6. YDO issues a Certificate of Scholarship to approved scholar
- Scholar requests for a Statement of Account (SOA) from their schools (if enrolled in Private Schools/Colleges/Universities)
- 8. Scholar receives the scholarship grant upon submission and YDO validation of the Statement of Account (SOA)

#### For Existing Scholars (Scholarship Renewal)

- 1. Scholar submits scholarship renewal requirements
- 2. Scholar receives notification that they qualify for scholarship renewal
- 3. YDO issues a Certificate of Scholarship to approved scholar
- Scholar requests for a Statement of Account (SOA) from their schools (if enrolled in Private Schools/Colleges/Universities)
- Scholar receives the scholarship grant upon submission and YDO validation of the Statement of Account (SOA)

- Scholars must meet/maintain the prescribed General Weighted Averages per scholarship category.
- Scholars with INCOMPLETE grades will be allowed to apply for scholarship grant. However, release of grant will be put on hold pending grade completion within the school term the scholarship is applied for and provided that the prescribed General Weighted Average is met.
- In any given semester, scholars with one DROPPED / FAILED subject will be allowed to apply for scholarship grant provided that the computed General Weighted Average of all subjects taken in the school term the scholarship is applied for meets the prescribed General Weighted Average.
- Scholarship will be renewed every regular school term and will cover the prescribed or remaining number of terms/years as per the scholar's curriculum/program/degree requirements.
- Scholars who are unable to meet the conditions for their scholarship have the option to apply in other categories and reapply in their original category, provided all qualifications are met.
- Scholars must carry the full load prescribed (or allowable) in the curriculum.

- 7. Scholars who shift courses or transfer schools may be allowed to apply for scholarship. However, the number of years/ school terms covered by the scholarship based on the scholar's first scholarship application will remain.
- 8. Scholarship grants may only be claimed until the succeeding semester.
- Scholars are encouraged to actively participate in community/special projects initiated by the City Government for the duration of his/her scholarship or as the need arises.
- 10. For Masters/Doctorate Students, theses/dissertations must incorporate policy/program proposals for the QC LGU and must be presented to the Scholarship Screening Committee. The Youth Development Office must be provided a copy of the scholars' policy/program proposals, at minimum, taking into consideration school policies on sharing of student theses and dissertations.
- Masters/Doctorate students must render service for a year after degree completion, or otherwise be required to pay the scholarship amount equivalent to 1 year.
- 12. Only one member per family may avail a scholarship grant at any given time.
- 13. Scholars of other national or private organizations will be allowed to avail scholarship grant from the city provided that the scholar meets all conditions stated in his/her other scholarships. In which case, the city will only cover the additional amount needed by the scholar, not exceeding the allowable scholarship grant for the scholarship category being applied for. Scholars of other LGUs, however, are not eligible for scholarship grant.
- 14. Scholars who are from private schools or from schools outside Quezon City may be allowed to apply for scholarship grant provided they meet the qualifications for Economic Scholarship. However, additional proof of income, proof of residence, or other related documents may be required.
- Additional documents may be required by the Youth Development Office, as the need arises.
- All other special cases will be raised to the Scholarship Screening Committee for appropriate action.

#### TERMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIP

The following constitute general grounds for termination of scholarship:

- 1. Non-fulfillment of conditions stated in the Scholarship Guidelines
- 2. Forging, falsification, and misrepresentation
- Conviction of a crime and health conditions that render the scholar unfit to pursue studies during the term/school year applied for
- 4. Other causes as may be determined by the Youth Development Office
