Local School Board Ordinance No. 6, S-2024

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR PRIORITY EDUCATION PROJECTS in the QUEZON CITY SCHOOL BOARD FOR FY 2025

Be it enacted by the Local School Board of Quezon City in Council assembled:

Section 1. Source of Funds. The following income as indicated hereof are hereby declared as sources of funds particularly, the additional one (1) Percent (1%) Tax on Real Property which are realistic and probable to be collected and be remitted to the Local Treasury, necessary to finance the implementation of priority education projects of the City of Quezon from January 1 to December 31, 2025, except otherwise specifically provided herein:


