S-2020

AN ORDINANCE CREATING NEW PLANTILLA POSITIONS FOR QUEZON CITY UNIVERSITY AND TO APPROPRIATE THE FUNDS NEEDED THEREOF.

WHEREAS, Section 1, Article XIV of the Philippine Constitution provides that the State shall protect and promote the rights of all citizens to quality education at all levels, and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all;

WHEREAS, Section 2 (1), Article XIV of the Philippine Constitution also provides that the State shall establish, maintain, and support a complete, adequate, and integrated system of education relevant to the needs of the people and society;

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WHEREAS, Section 3 (2), Article XIV of the provides that the state shall inculcate patriotism and nationalism, foster love of humanity, respect for human rights, appreciation of the role of national heroes in the historical development of the country, teach the rights and duties of citizenship, strengthen ethical and spiritual values, develop moral character and personal discipline, encourage critical and creative thinking, broaden scientific and technological knowledge, and promote vocational efficiency;

WHEREAS, Article III Sections 447, 458 and 468, of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, states that local government units may establish and provide for the operation of a vocational and technical school and similar post-secondary institution subject to availability of funds, and existing laws, rules and regulations;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Council enacted City Ordinance No. SP-2812, S-2019, entitled "An Ordinance Converting the Quezon City Polytechnic University to Quezon City University and enhancing its Charter (Amending City Ordinances Nos. SP-1945, S-2009 and SP-1030, S-2001";

WHEREAS, after its conception, the Quezon City University continues to grow in terms of its population serving and delivering free quality education to the constituency;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the pertinent provisions of Republic Act No. 7722, CMO No. 32, S-2006, promulgated the policies, standards and guidelines that shall govern the establishment of Local Colleges/Universities (LCUs) by Local Government Units (LGUs);

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10931, CMO No. 09, S-2018 laid down the guidelines on the eligibility of Local Universities and Colleges (LUCs) to carry out the free higher education provision of R.A. No. 10931 otherwise known as the "Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act";

WHEREAS, Quezon City University as a local institution of higher learning submitted an application for Institutional Recognition subject for the approval of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) in order to access and enjoy the empowering and equitable provisions of R.A. No. 10931;

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WHEREAS, as reflected in the Evaluation Report issued by the Office of Institutional Quality Assurance and indicated in CHED's 1st Indorsement letter dated June 29, 2020, Quezon City University was found to be non-compliant in creating and filling up of Mandatory Plantilla Positions relative to the application of the University for CHED's Institutional Recognition;

WHEREAS, based on the findings of CHED there is a need to create new Plantilla positions for Quezon City University to acquire its Institutional Recognition and to comply with the provisions of R.A. No. 10931.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. TITLE. - This Ordinance shall be known as the "Creation of New Plantilla Positions for Quezon City University."

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS. - As used in this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean as follows:

- a. Plantilla Position a government approved listing of positions in any governmental institution, instrumentality, and entity; both national and local; whether filled-up or vacant positions.
- b. University it is an institution of higher (or tertiary) education and research, which awards academic degrees in various academic disciplines. It is also referred to in this ordinance as the Quezon City University.
- c. Institutional Recognition it is a requirement of all Local Universities and Colleges to be complied with in order to operate as University and avail of all necessary programs of the Commission on Higher Education.



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SECTION 3. CREATION OF PLANTILLA POSITIONS. - The following new positions, in addition to the current staffing pattern of the University, are hereby created under the different offices/departments of the Quezon City University by the process of addition:

SECTION 4. FUNDING SUPPORT. - The newly-created positions are made part and an integral element of the plantilla of the Quezon City University and shall be automatically funded from the personnel services component of the budget of the Quezon City Government for the Quezon City University.

SECTION 5. REPEALING CLAUSE. - All ordinances, resolutions, rules or regulations inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. - If, for any reason, any section or provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid by a competent court, the remaining sections or provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

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SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. - This Ordinance shall take effect upon approval and publication in a newspaper of general or local circulation.
