RESOLUTION NO. SP- **6930**, S-2016

A RESOLUTION URGING THE QUEZON CITY LOCAL GOVERNMENT THROUGH THE QUEZON CITY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT OFFICE (QCDRRMO), IN COORDINATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT (DILG) AND OTHER SECTORS CONCERNED TO INTENSIFY ITS CITY-WIDE INFORMATION DRIVE ON CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION AND DISASTER RISK REDUCTION IN THE ONE HUNDRED FORTY TWO (142) BARANGAYS.

WHEREAS, according to a study made in 2009 by the Economy and Environment Program for Southeast Asia (EEPSEA), Metro Manila is the seventh most vulnerable in Southeast Asia in terms of its vulnerability to multiple climate hazards such as cyclones, landslides, earthquakes, floods and droughts; y


WHEREAS, the Quezon City is the most populated city in the Philippines with estimated 3,085,786 people during the 2014 census and as population increases, pollution and environmental degradation rises;

WHEREAS, various legislations were enacted to mitigate the effects of climate change and increase the community's resilience thereat, to wit:

- a. Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as the "Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction Management Act of 2010" that provides for a holistic approach in mitigating the effects of disaster and recognizes the necessity of being prepared for the eventuality of any disaster whether natural or man-made;*
- b. Ordinance No. SP-2290, S-2014, entitled "An Ordinance creating the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (QCDRRMO), defining its functions, duties and responsibilities, providing for its composition, appropriating funds thereof and for other purposes";*
- c. Resolution No. SP-5622, S-2012, entitled "A Resolution Directing all barangays of Quezon City to conduct seminars on effective Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation".*

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for the Quezon City local government to heighten public awareness and intensify its campaign over the adverse effects of climate change through communication campaigns, community dialogues, caucuses, seminars and symposiums in the 142 barangays;




NOW, THEREFORE,


