BAUTISTA, TO ESTABLISH AN NGO/PO MULTI-PURPOSE CENTER OR OFFICE WITHIN QUEZON CITY HALL COMPOUND/BUILDING TO CATER THE NEEDS AND ACCOMMODATE THE ACTIVITIES OF THE CITY'S ACCREDITED NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS (NGOs) AND PEOPLES ORGANIZATION (POs).

WHEREAS, the accredited number of Non-Governmental Organizations (NGO's) and Peoples Organizations (PO's) rose to, more or less, One Thousand Eighty One (1,081) composed of nineteen (19) different sectors as provided under City Ordinance No. 2524, S-2016, in compliance with the Rules and Regulations Implementing Republic Act No. 7160 (The Local Government Code);

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, is encouraging the active partnership of LGUs and NGOs/POs towards the city's development;

WHEREAS, the increasing number of NGOs and POs as reflected in the said ordinance necessitate the establishment of an NGO Center/Office to cater the needs and accommodate the activities of non-governmental organizations where sectoral leaders, officers and members may converge, hold meetings and festivities, public consultaions, workshops, trainings/seminars, and other activities beneficial to them and the city's inhabitants.

## NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to request, as it does hereby request the City Mayor, Honorable Herbert M. Bautista, to establish an NGO/PO Multi-Purpose Center or Office within Quezon City Hall Compound/Building to cater the needs and accommodate the activities of the City's Accredited Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and Peoples Organization (POs),

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the NGO/PO Center shall be under the joint supervision of the Office of the City Mayor, through the Community Relations Office (CRO), and the Committee on Public Affairs, Mass Media Information and People's Participation of the City Council.

RESOLVED, FINALLY, that the City General Services Department (CGSD) shall take charge in the maintenance of the NGO/PO Center and provide for the basic office equipment or supplies thereof.
