RESOLUTION NO. SP. 7246, S-2017

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR, HONORABLE HERBERT M. BAUTISTA, TO EXTEND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE PROVINCES OF APAYAO, CAGAYAN, ISABELA AND KALINGA, WHICH WERE SEVERELY AFFECTED BY TYPHOON "LAWIN", IN THE AMOUNT OF THIRTY SIX MILLION SEVENTY FOUR THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED FIFTEEN PESOS AND FIFTY NINE CENTAVOS (PHP36,074,915.59) TO BE TAKEN FROM THE QUEZON CITY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT FUND, SUBJECT TO EXISTING LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Introduced by Councilors RAMON P. MEDALLA and FRANZ S. PUMAREN.

WHEREAS, Super Typhoon "LAWIN" with International Name "HAIMA" was considered the strongest typhoon ever to hit Region II (Cagayan Valley) in 2016 with a category # 5 with a maximum sustained winds of 225 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 315 kph that made a landfall in Peñablanca, Cagayan last October 19, 2016;

WHEREAS, among the municipalities devastated by Super Typhoon "LAWIN" Region II in Cagayan Valley are: Ilagan, Isabela, Tabuk City, Apayao, Tuguegarao, Cagayan, Pinukpuk and Kalinga;

WHEREAS, the QC Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council approved Resolution No. 002, S = 2017, entitled "A Resolution Adopting the provinces of Apayao, Cagayan, Isabela, Kalinga as sister Local Government Units (LGUs) to be provided with financial and other means of humanitarian support by the Quezon City Government;

WHEREAS, Ilagan, Isabela Mayor Evelyn C. Diaz; Tabuk, Apayao Mayor Ferdinand B. Tubban; Tuguegarao, Cagayan Mayor Bienvenido De Guzman II; and Pinukpuk, Kalinga, Mayor Jimmy B. Dasayon have written to the Hon. Herbert M. Bautista, Mayor of Quezon City requesting for financial assistance to be used in the repair and restoration of the various government infrastructure and facilities; 4

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WHEREAS, in line with the aim of lending a helping hand in alleviating the lives of the people who were affected by typhoon "LAWIN", the following are the programs and detailed estimates for the proposed infrastructure projects damaged by Typhoon "LAWIN":

WHEREAS, Section 1, Rule 18, of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the Republic Act No. 10121 (The Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010) provides that upon the recommendation of the LDPPMC and approval of the Sanggunian concerned, the LDRRMC's may transfer the said fund to support the disaster risk reduction of other LDRRMC's which are declared under state of calamity.

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NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to authorize, as it does hereby authorize the City Mayor, Honorable Herbert M. Bautista, to extend financial assistance to the provinces of Apayao, Cagayan, Isabela and Kalinga, which were severely affected by Typhoon "LAWIN", in the amount of Thirty Six Million Seventy Four Thousand Nine Hundred Fifteen Pesos and Fifty Nine Centavos (Php36,074,915.59) to be taken from the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund, subject to existing laws, rules and regulations.
