**CREATING THE QUEZON CITY TASK FORCE PROJECT AURORA: UNIFIED
CCTV COMMAND SYSTEM**

WHEREAS, Sections 4 and 5, Article II of the 1987 Constitution establishes that the prime duty of the Government is to serve and protect the people, and that the maintenance of peace and order, the protection of life, liberty, and property, and promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act (RA) No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, mandates every Local Government Unit (LGU) to exercise powers essential to the promotion of the general welfare, and within their territorial jurisdiction ensure safety, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of the inhabitants;

WHEREAS, during her inaugural address on 29 June 2022, the Mayor highlighted Project Aurora, emphasizing, "*Kapag sabay nang gumagana pati ang CCTV cameras ng ating mga barangay at business establishments, bantay-sarado na ang kaligtasan ng ating mga Qcitizens*", thereby establishing one of the Administration's thrust and priorities, which is the safety and security of its citizens through the maintenance of peace, order and public safety throughout Quezon City;

WHEREAS, the vision of Quezon City is to sustain itself as a Quality Community, a progressive and peaceful, clean and orderly place, conducive and hospitable to living, employment, and business; this is pursued through the Mayor's Executive Agenda Item No. 6, To Build a Safer and More Resilient City; and is consistent with the City Government's pursuit of United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) No. 11, to make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable.

NOW THEREFORE, I, MA. JOSEFINA G. BELMONTE, Mayor of Quezon City, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. CREATION. The Quezon City Task Force (QCTF) Project Aurora: Unified CCTV Command System is hereby created.

SECTION 2. COMPOSITION. The QCTF Project Aurora shall be composed of the following:

- 2.1 Chairperson : City Mayor
- 2.2 Vice Chairperson: City Administrator
- 2.3 Focal Person : Assistant City Administrator for Operations

- 2.4 Members :
- District Director, Quezon City Police District
 - Head, Department of Public Order and Safety
 - Head, Transport and Traffic Management Department
 - Head, Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office
 - Head, City General Services Department
 - Head, Information Technology Development Department
 - Fire Marshall, Quezon City Fire District
 - Head, Engineering Department
 - Head, Department of the Building Official
 - Head, Business Permits and Licensing Department
 - Head, City Planning and Development Department
 - Head, Barangay and Community Relations Department
 - President, Liga ng mga Barangay
 - Chairperson, Sangguniang Panlungsod, Committee on Peace and Order
 - Other members, as may later be deemed necessary by directive of the City Mayor.

SECTION 3. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS. The QCTF Project Aurora shall have the following duties and functions:

- 3.1 Road Mapping and timeline for the project implementation. This includes:
 - 3.1.1 Augmentation of CCTV Cameras in strategic areas in Quezon City, in addition to the 442 cameras already installed.
 - 3.1.2 Securing of Fiber Optic Connection from the street cameras to the Quezon City Police District Command System in Camp Karingal, the Command System inside Quezon City Hall Compound, and the DRRMO Command Center.
 - 3.1.3 Securing of 24/7 Power Supply for installed CCTV Communication Box, covering all sites (CCTV and Base stations)
 - 3.1.4 Other upgrades and developments deemed necessary.
- 3.2 Facilitate all authorization, requests involving permits, right of way, road implementation and other authorizations required by related departments deemed necessary for the implementation of Project Aurora.
- 3.3 Coordinate and facilitate the sharing of databases between the key players.
- 3.4 Create an inventory of all CCTVs owned by the City Government, the Barangays, and those owned by Business Establishments, among others.
- 3.5 Provide budgetary requirements for all utilities and maintenance needed.
- 3.6 Provide technical support to proposed legislative measures and executive policy considerations relevant to Project Aurora.
- 3.7 Perform such other tasks as may be directed by the City Mayor.

SECTION 4. SECRETARIAT. The QCTF Project Aurora shall be assisted by a Secretariat headed by the Assistant City Administrator for Operations and comprising of a composite team from the City Administrator's Office, Department of Public Order and Safety, Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office, and the Quezon City Police District.


SECTION 5. RESOURCE AVAILABILITY. The Funding for the implementation of the project shall be sourced from the approved Peace and Order and Public Safety (POPS) Plan for Fiscal Year 2022-2025.

SECTION 6. CONSISTENCY WITH LOCAL PLANS. For planning purposes, the initiatives emanating from the QCTF Project Aurora shall be consistent with the Quezon City POPS Plan, Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP), and Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP).

SECTION 7. DISSEMINATION. A copy of this Executive Order shall be furnished to the Office of the President and the Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA) for information and guidance, pursuant to Section 455 (1) (xii) of RA 7160, as amended, and shall be posted at the official website of the Quezon City Government.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVITY. This order shall take effect immediately
