EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 25 Series of 2023

CREATING THE QUEZON CITY EL NIÑO TASK FORCE AND PROVIDING COMPOSITION AND FUNCTIONS THEREOF

WHEREAS, El Niño is a climate pattern characterized by unusually warmer than average sea surface temperatures in the eastern tropical Pacific Ocean;

WHEREAS, an El Niño Watch is issued when conditions arise that may lead to the probable development of El Niño within the next six (6) months;

WHEREAS, based on recent conditions and forecast models indicating that the El Niño season will likely develop within July to September of this year, and possibly persist until 2024, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) has raised the El Niño Southern Oscillation (ENSO) Alert and Warning System, into an El Niño Watch;

WHEREAS, with El Niño increasing the likelihood of drought and flooding, consequently raising water, food security, and health concerns, the Quezon City Government in accordance with Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Memorandum Circular (MC) No. 2023-065, recognizes the need to mitigate, prevent, or otherwise address such concerns to ensure the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of Quezon City.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MA. JOSEFINA G. BELMONTE, City Mayor of Quezon City, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. CONSTITUTION. The Quezon City *El Niño* Task Force is hereby created for the purpose of developing, implementing, and/or enforcing plans, programs, and policies which may be effected to mitigate, prevent, or otherwise address the deleterious effects which may be brought about by *El Niño*.

SECTION 2. COMPOSITION AND ORGANIZATION. The Task Force shall be composed of the following:

At any time, the City Mayor as the Task Force Chairperson may, at her discretion, change the composition of the Task Force for it to be more responsive to the goals of this Executive Order.

SECTION 3. FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES. The Task Force shall perform the following functions, duties, and responsibilities:

- a) Assess and evaluate areas of concern which may be negatively affected by El Niño, and develop plans, programs, and policies to prevent, mitigate, or otherwise address such concerns;
- Propose ordinances, resolutions, and other measures, which may address El Niño concerns, including but not limited to responsible water use, and the maintenance of a clean environment;
- Develop plans with the water concessionaires to ensure the availability of water and water delivery systems;
- d) Ensure the implementation and modification of any El Niño or other related preparedness plans to prevent, mitigate, or otherwise address El Niño related concerns;
- e) Coordinate with concerned National Government Agencies, the academe and other appropriate entities, to access relevant information and methods in combating the deleterious effects of El Niño;
- f) Intensify information campaigns to spread awareness on El Niño prevention and mitigation measures;
- g) Identify and mobilize the necessary resources, including but not limited to funds, personnel, and equipment to be maintained for the purposes required under this Executive Order;
- Report its findings, proposed plans, programs, and policies, necessary for the prevention and mitigation of El Niño concerns; and
- Such other duties and functions necessary for the full and proper achievement of the purposes of this Executive Order.

SECTION 4. RESOURCE AVAILABILITY. The funds necessary for the operation of the Task Force shall be sourced from the available funds of the Task Force member Departments and Offices, and if so required, the Office of the City Mayor may augment such funds, subject to usual accounting rules and procedures.

SECTION 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. The provisions of this Executive Order are hereby declared separable and in the event that any such provision is declared unconstitutional, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. DISSEMINATION. A copy of this Executive Order shall be furnished to the Office of the President and the Metropolitan Manila Development Authority for information and guidance, pursuant to Sec. 455 (1) (xii) of Republic Act No. 7160 or the Local Government Code, and shall be posted at the official website of the City.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
