#### **Preface**

These Philippine Bidding Documents (PBDs) for the procurement of Infrastructure Projects (hereinafter referred to also as the "Works") through Competitive Bidding have been prepared by the Government of the Philippines for use by all branches, agencies, departments, bureaus, offices, or instrumentalities of the government, including government-owned and/or -controlled corporations, government financial institutions, state universities and colleges, local government units, and autonomous regional government. The procedures and practices presented in this document have been developed through broad experience, and are for mandatory use in projects that are financed in whole or in part by the Government of the Philippines or any foreign government/foreign or international financing institution in accordance with the provisions of the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184.

The PBDs are intended as a model for admeasurements (unit prices or unit rates in a bill of quantities) types of contract, which are the most common in Works contracting.

The Bidding Documents shall clearly and adequately define, among others: (i) the objectives, scope, and expected outputs and/or results of the proposed contract; (ii) the eligibility requirements of Bidders; (iii) the expected contract duration; and (iv)the obligations, duties, and/or functions of the winning Bidder.

Care should be taken to check the relevance of the provisions of the PBDs against the requirements of the specific Works to be procured. If duplication of a subject is inevitable in other sections of the document prepared by the Procuring Entity, care must be exercised to avoid contradictions between clauses dealing with the same matter.

Moreover, each section is prepared with notes intended only as information for the Procuring Entity or the person drafting the Bidding Documents. They shall not be included in the final documents. The following general directions should be observed when using the documents:

- a. All the documents listed in the Table of Contents are normally required for the procurement of Infrastructure Projects. However, they should be adapted as necessary to the circumstances of the particular Project.
- b. Specific details, such as the "name of the Procuring Entity" and "address for bid submission," should be furnished in the Instructions to Bidders, Bid Data Sheet, and Special Conditions of Contract. The final documents should contain neither blank spaces nor options.
- c. This Preface and the footnotes or notes in italics included in the Invitation to Bid, BDS, General Conditions of Contract, Special Conditions of Contract, Specifications, Drawings, and Bill of Quantities are not part of the text of the final document, although they contain instructions that the Procuring Entity should strictly follow.
- d. The cover should be modified as required to identify the Bidding Documents as to the names of the Project, Contract, and Procuring Entity, in addition to date of issue.

- e. Modifications for specific Procurement Project details should be provided in the Special Conditions of Contract as amendments to the Conditions of Contract. For easy completion, whenever reference has to be made to specific clauses in the Bid Data Sheet or Special Conditions of Contract, these terms shall be printed in bold typeface on Sections I (Instructions to Bidders) and III (General Conditions of Contract), respectively.
- f. For guidelines on the use of Bidding Forms and the procurement of Foreign-Assisted Projects, these will be covered by a separate issuance of the Government Procurement Policy Board.

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## Glossary of Terms, Abbreviations, and Acronyms

**ABC** – Approved Budget for the Contract.

**ARCC** – Allowable Range of Contract Cost.

**BAC** – Bids and Awards Committee.

**Bid** – A signed offer or proposal to undertake a contract submitted by a bidder in response to and in consonance with the requirements of the bidding documents. Also referred to as *Proposal* and *Tender*. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[c])

**Bidder** – Refers to a contractor, manufacturer, supplier, distributor and/or consultant who submits a bid in response to the requirements of the Bidding Documents. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[d])

**Bidding Documents** – The documents issued by the Procuring Entity as the bases for bids, furnishing all information necessary for a prospective bidder to prepare a bid for the Goods, Infrastructure Projects, and/or Consulting Services required by the Procuring Entity. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[e])

**BIR** – Bureau of Internal Revenue.

**BSP** – Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas.

**CDA** – Cooperative Development Authority.

Consulting Services – Refer to services for Infrastructure Projects and other types of projects or activities of the GOP requiring adequate external technical and professional expertise that are beyond the capability and/or capacity of the GOP to undertake such as, but not limited to: (i) advisory and review services; (ii) pre-investment or feasibility studies; (iii) design; (iv) construction supervision; (v) management and related services; and (vi) other technical services or special studies. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[i])

Contract – Refers to the agreement entered into between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier or Manufacturer or Distributor or Service Provider for procurement of Goods and Services; Contractor for Procurement of Infrastructure Projects; or Consultant or Consulting Firm for Procurement of Consulting Services; as the case may be, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

**Contractor** – is a natural or juridical entity whose proposal was accepted by the Procuring Entity and to whom the Contract to execute the Work was awarded. Contractor as used in these Bidding Documents may likewise refer to a supplier, distributor, manufacturer, or consultant.

**CPI** – Consumer Price Index.

**DOLE** – Department of Labor and Employment.

**DTI** – Department of Trade and Industry.

**Foreign-funded Procurement or Foreign-Assisted Project** – Refers to procurement whose funding source is from a foreign government, foreign or international financing institution as specified in the Treaty or International or Executive Agreement. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[b]).

**GFI** – Government Financial Institution.

**GOCC** – Government-owned and/or –controlled corporation.

Goods – Refer to all items, supplies, materials and general support services, except Consulting Services and Infrastructure Projects, which may be needed in the transaction of public businesses or in the pursuit of any government undertaking, project or activity, whether in the nature of equipment, furniture, stationery, materials for construction, or personal property of any kind, including non-personal or contractual services such as the repair and maintenance of equipment and furniture, as well as trucking, hauling, janitorial, security, and related or analogous services, as well as procurement of materials and supplies provided by the Procuring Entity for such services. The term "related" or "analogous services" shall include, but is not limited to, lease or purchase of office space, media advertisements, health maintenance services, and other services essential to the operation of the Procuring Entity. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[r])

**GOP** – Government of the Philippines.

**Infrastructure Projects** – Include the construction, improvement, rehabilitation, demolition, repair, restoration or maintenance of roads and bridges, railways, airports, seaports, communication facilities, civil works components of information technology projects, irrigation, flood control and drainage, water supply, sanitation, sewerage and solid waste management systems, shore protection, energy/power and electrification facilities, national buildings, school buildings, hospital buildings, and other related construction projects of the government. Also referred to as *civil works or works*. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[u])

**LGUs** – Local Government Units.

**NFCC** – Net Financial Contracting Capacity.

**NGA** – National Government Agency.

**PCAB** – Philippine Contractors Accreditation Board.

**PhilGEPS** - Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System.

**Procurement Project** – refers to a specific or identified procurement covering goods, infrastructure project or consulting services. A Procurement Project shall be described, detailed, and scheduled in the Project Procurement Management Plan prepared by the agency which shall be consolidated in the procuring entity's Annual Procurement Plan. (GPPB Circular No. 06-2019 dated 17 July 2019)

#### Section I. Invitation to Bid

#### **Notes on the Invitation to Bid**

The Invitation to Bid (IB) provides information that enables potential Bidders to decide whether to participate in the procurement at hand. The IB shall be posted in accordance with Section 21.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

Apart from the essential items listed in the Bidding Documents, the IB should also indicate the following:

- a. The date of availability of the Bidding Documents, which shall be from the time the IB is first advertised/posted until the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids;
- b. The place where the Bidding Documents may be acquired or the website where it may be downloaded;
- c. The deadline for the submission and receipt of bids; and
- d. Any important bid evaluation criteria.

The IB should be incorporated into the Bidding Documents. The information contained in the IB must conform to the Bidding Documents and in particular to the relevant information in the Bid Data Sheet.

## Section II. Instructions to Bidders

#### **Notes on the Instructions to Bidders**

This Section on the Instruction to Bidders (ITB) provides the information necessary for bidders to prepare responsive bids, in accordance with the requirements of the Procuring Entity. It also provides information on bid submission, eligibility check, opening and evaluation of bids, post-qualification, and on the award of contract.

#### 1. Scope of Bid

The Procuring Entity, Quezon City Government invites Bids for the PROPOSED REHABILITATION OF CIVIC CENTER BUILDING A BASEMENT TO FIFTH FLOOR AT BARANGAY CENTRAL, with Project Identification Number 23-00179.

[Note: The Project Identification Number is assigned by the Procuring Entity based on its own coding scheme and is not the same as the PhilGEPS reference number, which is generated after the posting of the bid opportunity on the PhilGEPS website.]

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as "Project") is for the construction of Works, as described in Section VI (Specifications).

#### 2. Funding Information

- 2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for 2023 in the amount of Forty-Four Million One Hundred Forty-Three Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-Two Pesos and 86/100 Ctvs. (44,143,452.86).
- 2.2. The source of funding is:
  - a. LGUs, the Annual or Supplemental Budget, as approved by the Sanggunian.

#### 3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manual and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or invitation to bid by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have inspected the site, determined the general characteristics of the contracted Works and the conditions for this Project, such as the location and the nature of the work; (b) climatic conditions; (c) transportation facilities; (c) nature and condition of the terrain, geological conditions at the site communication facilities, requirements, location and availability of construction aggregates and other materials, labor, water, electric power and access roads; and (d) other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

#### 4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, Coercive, and Obstructive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Contractors, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or

through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices defined under Annex "I" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.

#### 5. Eligible Bidders

- 5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.
- 5.2. The Bidder must have an experience of having completed a Single Largest Completed Contract (SLCC) that is similar to this Project, equivalent to at least fifty percent (50%) of the ABC adjusted, if necessary, by the Bidder to current prices using the PSA's CPI, except under conditions provided for in Section 23.4.2.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

A contract is considered to be "similar" to the contract to be bid if it has the major categories of work stated in the **BDS**.

- 5.3. For Foreign-funded Procurement, the Procuring Entity and the foreign government/foreign or international financing institution may agree on another track record requirement, as specified in the Bidding Document prepared for this purpose.
- 5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.2 of the 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

#### 6. Origin of Associated Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of Goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN.

#### 7. Subcontracts

7.1. The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than fifty percent (50%) of the Project.

The Procuring Entity has prescribed that:

#### a. Subcontracting is not allowed.

- 7.1. [If Procuring Entity has determined that subcontracting is allowed during the bidding, state:] The Bidder must submit together with its Bid the documentary requirements of the subcontractor(s) complying with the eligibility criterial stated in ITB Clause 5 in accordance with Section 23.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 pursuant to Section 23.1 thereof.
- 7.2. [If subcontracting is allowed during the contract implementation stage, state:] The Supplier may identify its subcontractor during the contract implementation stage. Subcontractors identified during the bidding may be changed during the

implementation of this Contract. Subcontractors must submit the documentary requirements under Section 23.1 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 and comply with the eligibility criteria specified in **ITB** Clause 5 to the implementing or end-user unit.

7.3. Subcontracting of any portion of the Project does not relieve the Contractor of any liability or obligation under the Contract. The Supplier will be responsible for the acts, defaults, and negligence of any subcontractor, its agents, servants, or workmen as fully as if these were the Contractor's own acts, defaults, or negligence, or those of its agents, servants, or workmen.

#### 8. Pre-Bid Conference

#### 9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the Procuring Entity, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the **IB**, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.

# 10. Documents Comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in **Section IX. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents**.
- 10.2. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. For Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.
- 10.3. A valid PCAB License is required, and in case of joint ventures, a valid special PCAB License, and registration for the type and cost of the contract for this Project. Any additional type of Contractor license or permit shall be indicated in the **BDS**.

- 10.4. A List of Contractor's key personnel (e.g., Project Manager, Project Engineers, Materials Engineers, and Foremen) assigned to the contract to be bid, with their complete qualification and experience data shall be provided. These key personnel must meet the required minimum years of experience set in the **BDS**.
- 10.5. A List of Contractor's major equipment units, which are owned, leased, and/or under purchase agreements, supported by proof of ownership, certification of availability of equipment from the equipment lessor/vendor for the duration of the project, as the case may be, must meet the minimum requirements for the contract set in the **BDS**.

#### 11. Documents Comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in **Section IX. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents**.
- 11.2. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the **IB** shall not be accepted.
- 11.3. For Foreign-funded procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 31.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

#### 12. Alternative Bids

Bidders shall submit offers that comply with the requirements of the Bidding Documents, including the basic technical design as indicated in the drawings and specifications. Unless there is a value engineering clause in the **BDS**, alternative Bids shall not be accepted.

#### 13. Bid Prices

All bid prices for the given scope of work in the Project as awarded shall be considered as fixed prices, and therefore not subject to price escalation during contract implementation, except under extraordinary circumstances as determined by the NEDA and approved by the GPPB pursuant to the revised Guidelines for Contract Price Escalation guidelines.

#### 14. Bid and Payment Currencies

- 14.1. Bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.
- 14.2. Payment of the contract price shall be made in:
  - a. Philippine Pesos.

#### 15. Bid Security

- 15.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration or any form of Bid Security in the amount indicated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the **BDS**.
- 15.2. The Bid and bid security in no case shall exceed One Hundred Twenty (120) calendar days from the date of opening of bids, unless duly extended by the bidder upon the request of the Head of the Procuring Entity (HoPE) of the Quezon City Local Government. Any bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.

#### 16. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit one copy of the first and second components of its Bid.

The Procuring Entity may request additional hard copies and/or electronic copies of the Bid. However, failure of the Bidders to comply with the said request shall not be a ground for disqualification.

If the Procuring Entity allows the submission of bids through online submission to the given website or any other electronic means, the Bidder shall submit an electronic copy of its Bid, which must be digitally signed. An electronic copy that cannot be opened or is corrupted shall be considered non-responsive and, thus, automatically disqualified.

#### 17. Deadline for Submission of Bids

The Bidders shall submit on the specified date and time and either at its physical address or through online submission as indicated in paragraph 5 of the IB.

#### 18. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

18.1. The BAC shall open the Bids in public at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in paragraph 9 of the **IB**. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. In case videoconferencing, webcasting or other similar technologies will be used, attendance of participants shall likewise be recorded by the BAC Secretariat.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

18.2. The preliminary examination of Bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

#### 19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

- 19.1. The Procuring Entity's BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "passed" using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, all Bids and combinations of Bids as indicated in the **BDS** shall be received by the same deadline and opened and evaluated simultaneously so as to determine the Bid or combination of Bids offering the lowest calculated cost to the Procuring Entity. Bid Security as required by **ITB** Clause 15 shall be submitted for each contract (lot) separately.
- 19.3. In all cases, the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots participated in by the prospective Bidder.

#### 20. Post Qualification

Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS), and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the **BDS**.

#### 21. Signing of the Contract

The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the **BDS**.

### Section III. Bid Data Sheet

#### **Notes on the Bid Data Sheet (BDS)**

The Bid Data Sheet (BDS) consists of provisions that supplement, amend, or specify in detail, information, or requirements included in the ITB found in Section II, which are specific to each procurement.

This Section is intended to assist the Procuring Entity in providing the specific information in relation to corresponding clauses in the ITB and has to be prepared for each specific procurement.

The Procuring Entity should specify in the BDS information and requirements specific to the circumstances of the Procuring Entity, the processing of the procurement, and the bid evaluation criteria that will apply to the Bids. In preparing the BDS, the following aspects should be checked:

- a. Information that specifies and complements provisions of the ITB must be incorporated.
- b. Amendments and/or supplements, if any, to provisions of the ITB as necessitated by the circumstances of the specific procurement, must also be incorporated.

## Section IV. General Conditions of Contract

#### **Notes on the General Conditions of Contract**

The General Conditions of Contract (GCC) in this Section, read in conjunction with the Special Conditions of Contract in Section V and other documents listed therein, should be a complete document expressing all the rights and obligations of the parties.

Matters governing performance of the Contractor, payments under the contract, or matters affecting the risks, rights, and obligations of the parties under the contract are included in the GCC and Special Conditions of Contract.

Any complementary information, which may be needed, shall be introduced only through the Special Conditions of Contract.

#### 1. Scope of Contract

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

#### 2. Sectional Completion of Works

If sectional completion is specified in the **Special Conditions of Contract** (SCC), references in the Conditions of Contract to the Works, the Completion Date, and the Intended Completion Date shall apply to any Section of the Works (other than references to the Completion Date and Intended Completion Date for the whole of the Works).

#### 3. Possession of Site

- 3.1 The Procuring Entity shall give possession of all or parts of the Site to the Contractor based on the schedule of delivery indicated in the SCC, which corresponds to the execution of the Works. If the Contractor suffers delay or incurs cost from failure on the part of the Procuring Entity to give possession in accordance with the terms of this clause, the Procuring Entity's Representative shall give the Contractor a Contract Time Extension and certify such sum as fair to cover the cost incurred, which sum shall be paid by Procuring Entity.
  - 3.2 If possession of a portion is not given by the above date, the Procuring Entity will be deemed to have delayed the start of the relevant activities. The resulting adjustments in contract time to address such delay may be addressed through contract extension provided under Annex "E" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

#### 4. The Contractor's Obligations

The Contractor shall employ the key personnel named in the Schedule of Key Personnel indicating their designation, in accordance with **ITB** Clause 10.3 and specified in the **BDS**, to carry out the supervision of the Works.

The Procuring Entity will approve any proposed replacement of key personnel only if their relevant qualifications and abilities are equal to or better than those of the personnel listed in the Schedule.

#### 5. Performance Security

- 5.1. Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than the signing of the contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any of the forms prescribed in Section 39 of the 2016 revised IRR.
- 5.2. The Contractor, by entering into the Contract with the Procuring Entity, acknowledges the right of the Procuring Entity to institute action pursuant to RA No. 3688 against any subcontractor be they an individual, firm, partnership, corporation, or association supplying the Contractor with labor, materials and/or equipment for the performance of this Contract.

#### 6. Site Investigation Reports

The Contractor, in preparing the Bid, shall rely on any Site Investigation Reports referred to in the SCC supplemented by any information obtained by the Contractor.

#### 7. Warranty

- 7.1. In case the Contractor fails to undertake the repair works under Section 62.2.2 of the 2016 revised IRR, the Procuring Entity shall forfeit its performance security, subject its property(ies) to attachment or garnishment proceedings, and perpetually disqualify it from participating in any public bidding. All payables of the GOP in his favor shall be offset to recover the costs.
- 7.2. The warranty against Structural Defects/Failures, except that occasioned-on force majeure, shall cover the period from the date of issuance of the Certificate of Final Acceptance by the Procuring Entity. Specific duration of the warranty is found in the **SCC**.

#### 8. Liability of the Contractor

Subject to additional provisions, if any, set forth in the SCC, the Contractor's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

If the Contractor is a joint venture, all partners to the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable to the Procuring Entity.

#### 9. Termination for Other Causes

Contract termination shall be initiated in case it is determined *prima facie* by the Procuring Entity that the Contractor has engaged, before, or during the implementation of the contract, in unlawful deeds and behaviors relative to contract acquisition and implementation, such as, but not limited to corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices as stated in **ITB** Clause 4.

#### 10. Dayworks

Subject to the guidelines on Variation Order in Annex "E" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, and if applicable as indicated in the SCC, the Dayworks rates in the Contractor's Bid shall be used for small additional amounts of work only when the Procuring Entity's Representative has given written instructions in advance for additional work to be paid for in that way.

#### 11. Program of Work

- 11.1. The Contractor shall submit to the Procuring Entity's Representative for approval the said Program of Work showing the general methods, arrangements, order, and timing for all the activities in the Works. The submissions of the Program of Work are indicated in the **SCC**.
- 11.2. The Contractor shall submit to the Procuring Entity's Representative for approval an updated Program of Work at intervals no longer than the period stated in the SCC. If the Contractor does not submit an updated Program of Work within this period, the Procuring Entity's Representative may withhold the amount stated in the SCC from the next payment certificate and continue to withhold this amount until the next payment after the date on which the overdue Program of Work has been submitted.

#### 12. Instructions, Inspections and Audits

The Contractor shall permit the GOP or the Procuring Entity to inspect the Contractor's accounts and records relating to the performance of the Contractor and to have them audited by auditors of the GOP or the Procuring Entity, as may be required.

#### 13. Advance Payment

The Procuring Entity shall, upon a written request of the Contractor which shall be submitted as a Contract document, make an advance payment to the Contractor in an amount not exceeding fifteen percent (15%) of the total contract price, to be made in lump sum, or at the most two installments according to a schedule specified in the **SCC**, subject to the requirements in Annex "E" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

#### 14. Progress Payments

The Contractor may submit a request for payment for Work accomplished. Such requests for payment shall be verified and certified by the Procuring Entity's Representative/Project Engineer. Except as otherwise stipulated in the SCC, materials and equipment delivered on the site but not completely put in place shall not be included for payment.

#### 15. Operating and Maintenance Manuals

15.1. If required, the Contractor will provide "as built" Drawings and/or operating and maintenance manuals as specified in the **SCC**.

15.2. If the Contractor does not provide the Drawings and/or manuals by the dates stated above, or they do not receive the Procuring Entity's Representative's approval, the Procuring Entity's Representative may withhold the amount stated in the **SCC** from payments due to the Contractor.

## Section V. Special Conditions of Contract

#### **Notes on the Special Conditions of Contract**

Similar to the BDS, the clauses in this Section are intended to assist the Procuring Entity in providing contract-specific information in relation to corresponding clauses in the GCC found in Section IV.

The Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) complement the GCC, specifying contractual requirements linked to the special circumstances of the Procuring Entity, the Procuring Entity's country, the sector, and the Works procured. In preparing this Section, the following aspects should be checked:

- a. Information that complements provisions of the GCC must be incorporated.
- b. Amendments and/or supplements to provisions of the GCC as necessitated by the circumstances of the specific purchase, must also be incorporated.

However, no special condition which defeats or negates the general intent and purpose of the provisions of the GCC should be incorporated herein.

## Section VI. Specifications

#### **Notes on Specifications**

A set of precise and clear specifications is a prerequisite for Bidders to respond realistically and competitively to the requirements of the Procuring Entity without qualifying or conditioning their Bids. In the context of international competitive bidding, the specifications must be drafted to permit the widest possible competition and, at the same time, present a clear statement of the required standards of workmanship, materials, and performance of the goods and services to be procured. Only if this is done will the objectives of economy, efficiency, and fairness in procurement be realized, responsiveness of Bids be ensured, and the subsequent task of bid evaluation facilitated. The specifications should require that all goods and materials to be incorporated in the Works be new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the Contract.

Samples of specifications from previous similar projects are useful in this respect. The use of metric units is mandatory. Most specifications are normally written specially by the Procuring Entity or its representative to suit the Works at hand. There is no standard set of Specifications for universal application in all sectors in all regions, but there are established principles and practices, which are reflected in these PBDs.

There are considerable advantages in standardizing General Specifications for repetitive Works in recognized public sectors, such as highways, ports, railways, urban housing, irrigation, and water supply, in the same country or region where similar conditions prevail. The General Specifications should cover all classes of workmanship, materials, and equipment commonly involved in construction, although not necessarily to be used in a particular Works Contract. Deletions or addenda should then adapt the General Specifications to the particular Works.

Care must be taken in drafting specifications to ensure that they are not restrictive. In the specification of standards for goods, materials, and workmanship, recognized international standards should be used as much as possible. Where other particular standards are used, whether national standards or other standards, the specifications should state that goods, materials, and workmanship that meet other authoritative standards, and which ensure substantially equal or higher quality than the standards mentioned, will also be acceptable. The following clause may be inserted in the SCC.

#### Sample Clause: Equivalency of Standards and Codes

Wherever reference is made in the Contract to specific standards and codes to be met by the goods and materials to be furnished, and work performed or tested, the provisions of the latest current edition or revision of the relevant standards and codes in effect shall apply, unless otherwise expressly stated in the Contract. Where such standards and codes are national, or relate to a particular country or region, other authoritative standards that ensure a substantially equal or higher quality than the standards and codes specified will be accepted

subject to the Procuring Entity's Representative's prior review and written consent. Differences between the standards specified and the proposed alternative standards shall be fully described in writing by the Contractor and submitted to the Procuring Entity's Representative at least twenty-eight (28) days prior to the date when the Contractor desires the Procuring Entity's Representative's consent. In the event the Procuring Entity's Representative determines that such proposed deviations do not ensure substantially equal or higher quality, the Contractor shall comply with the standards specified in the documents.

These notes are intended only as information for the Procuring Entity or the person drafting the Bidding Documents. They should not be included in the final Bidding Documents.

#### TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

#### 1. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- A. Compty with the current and existing laws, ordinances and applicable codes, rules and regulations, and standards. Any works performed contrary to the existing laws, rules and regulations, ordinances and standards without notice shall beer all cost arising therefrom.
- B. Drawings, specifications, codes and standards are minimum requirements. Where requirements differ, the more stringent apply
- C. Should there be any change(s) in drawings or specifications, it is required to comply with the governing regulations, ristify the implementing agency.
- O. Photographs shall be taken as, when and where directed at intervals of not more than one month. The photographs shall be sufficient in number and location, to record the exact prograps of the works. The photographs shall be retained and will become the property of the Government.
- E. Site verification / inspection shall be conducted to validate the scope of works. No extra compensation and extension of time shall be given due to negligence or inadvertence.
- F. The quality of materials shall be of the best grade of their respective kinds for the purpose. The work shall also be performed in the best and most capable marker in strict accordance with requirements of the plans and details. All materials not conforming to the requirements of these specifications shall be considered as defective.
- G. All equipment and installations shall meet or exceed minimum requirements of the standards and codes.

#### H. Mobilization and Demobilization (if applicable).

- Mobilization shall include all activities and related costs for transportation of personnel, equipment, and operating supplies to the site; establishment of offices, buildings, and other necessary general lecilities for the operations at the site.
- 2. Demobilization shall include all activities and costs for transportation of personnel, equipment, and supplies not anymore required within the construction site including the disassembly, removal and site clean-up of offices and other facilities assembled on the site specifically for this contract.
- Execute work in strict accordance with the best practices of the tracks in a thorough, substantial, workmantike marrier by competent workman. Provide a competent, experienced, full-time supervisor who is authorized to make decisions on behalf of the Contractor.
- J. Temporary Facilities and Utilities
  - All facilities shall be near the job site, where necessary and shall conform to the best stendard for the required types.
  - Temporary facilities shall be provided and maintained including sanitary facilities and first aid stations.

- Temporary utilities shall be sufficiently provided until the completion of the project such as water, power and communication.
- Temporary enclosure shall be provided around the construction sits with adequate guert lights, radings and proper signage.
- Temporary roadways shall be constructed and maintained to sustain loads to be carried on them during the entire construction period.
- Upon completion of the work, the temporary facilities shall be demofished, hauled-out and disposed property.
- K. Adequate construction safety and health protection shall be provided at all times during the execution of work to both workers and property.
  - A fully-trained Medical Aide shall be employed permanently on the site who shall be engaged solely to medical duties.
  - The medical room shall be provided with waterproofing; it could be a building of room designated and used exclusively for the purpose and have a floor area of at least 15 square meters and a glazed window area of at least 2 square meters.
  - The location of the medical more and any other arrangements shall be made known to all employees by posting on prominent locations and suitable notices in the site.
  - Additional safety precautions shall be provided in the event of a pandemic. Protocols
    set forth by the government shall be strictly followed:
  - Construction safety shall consist of construction canopy and safety net.
- Mecessary protections to the adjacent property shall be provided to avoid untoward incidents / accidents.
- M. Final cleaning of the work shall be employed prior to the final inspection for the certification of final acceptance. Final cleaning shall be applied on each surface or unit of work and shall be of condition expected for a building cleaning and maintenance program.

#### E CIVIL / STRUCTURAL WORKS

#### A. CONCRETE WORKS

- Delivery, Storage, and Handling: All materials shall be to delivered, stored, and handled as to prevent the inclusion of foreign materials and the damage of materials by water or breakage. Package materials shall be delivered and stored in original packages until ready to be used. Packages or materials showing evidence of water or other damage shall be rejected.
- 2. Unless otherwise specified herein, concrete works shall conform to the requirements of the ACI Building Code. Full cooperation shall be given on trades to install embedded items. Provisions shall be made for setting dams not placed in the torms. Before concrete is placed, embedded items shall have been inspected and tested for concrete aggregates and other materials shall have been done.

#### 3 Materials

- Cement for concrete shall conform to the requirements of specifications for Portland Cement (ASTM C + 150).
- Water used in muong concrete shall be clean and free from other injurious emounts of oils, ecids, attatine, organic materials or other substances that may be deleterious to concrete or steel.
- c. Fine aggregates shall be beach or river send conforming to ASTM C33, "Specification for Concrete Aggregates". Sand particle shall be course, sharp, clean free from salt, dust, loam, dirt and all toreign matters.



Coarse aggregates shall be either natural gravel or crushed rock conforming to the "Specifications for Concrete Aggregates (ASTM C33). The minimum size of aggregates shall be larger than one fifth (1/5) of the narrowest dimensions between sides of the forms within which the concrete is to be cest nor larger than three fourths (3/4) of the minimum clear specing between reinforcing bers and forms.

#### 4. Proportioning and Muting

 Proportioning and mixing of concrete shall conform to the requirements for them 405 of the standard specification with the following proportions:

Cement Sand, Gravel Class "A" - 1; 2; 3 Class "B" - 1; 2; 4 Class "C" - 1; 2 %

- Concrete minture to be used for concrete shall conform with the structural requirements
- c. Mixing concrete shall be machine mixed. Mixing shall begin within 30 minutes after the content has been added to the appreciates.

#### 5 Forms

General Forms shalf be used whetever necessary to confine the concrete and shape it to the required lines, or to insure the concrete of contamination with materials caving from adjacent, excevated surfaces. Forms shalf have sufficient strength to withstand the pressure resulting from placement and vibration of the concrete, and shalf be maintained rigidly in correct position. Forms shalf be sufficiently tight to prevent loss or montar from the concrete. Forms shalf be W (firms) thick ordinary physical and form lumber.
- Cleaning of Forms before placing the concrete, the contact surfaces of the formed hall be cleaned of encrustations of mortar, the grout or other foreign material.
- c. Removal of Forms forms shall be removed in a manner which will prevent damage to the concrete. Forms shall not be removed without approval. Any repeirs of surface imperfections shall be formed at once and airing shall be started as soon as the surface is sufficiently hard to permit it without further damage.

#### 6. Placing Reinforcement:

Steel reinforcement shall be provided as indicated, together with all necessary (is wires, chairs, spacers, supports and other devices necessary to install and secure the reinforcement property. All reinforcement, when placed, shall be free from loose, fisky rust and scale, oil, grease, day and other coating and foreign substances that would reduce or destroy its bond with concrete. Reinforcement shall be placed accurately and secured in place by use of metal or concrete supports, spacers and ties. Such supports shall be used in such marker that they will not be exposed or contribute in any way, to the discoloration or deterioration of the concrete.

#### Conveying and Placing Concrete:

- a. Conveying concrete shall be conveyed from mixer to forms as repidly as applicable, by methods which will prevent segregation, or loss of ingredients. There will be no vertical drop greater than 1.5 meters except where suitable equipment is provided to prevent segregation and where specifically authorized.
- b. Placing concrete shall be worked readily into the corners and angles of the forms and around all reprocessment and subadded items without permitting the material to segregate, concrete shall be deposited as close as possible to its final position in the forms so that flow within the mass does not exceed two (2) maters and consequently segregation is reduced to a minimum near forms or embedded items, or elsewhere as directed, the discharge shall be so

controlled that the concrete may be effectively compacted into horizontal layers not exceeding 30 centimeters in depth within the maximum lateral movement specified.

- c. Time interval between mixing and placing. Concrete shall be placed before initial set has occurred and before it has contained its water content for more than 45 minutes. No concrete mix shall be placed before 50 complete revolution of the machine mixer.
- d. Consolidation of Concrete concrete shall be consolidated with the aid of mechanical vibrating equipment and supplemented by the hand specing end tamping. Vibrations shall not be inserted into lower cursed that have commenced initial set; and reinforcement embedded in concepts beginning to set or already set shall not be disturbed by vibrators. Consolidation around major embedded parts shall by hand speding and tamping and vibrators shall not be used.
- e. Placing Concrete through reinforcement In placing concrete through reinforcement, care shall be taken that no segregation of the coarse aggregate occurs. On the bottom of beams and slabs, where the congestion of steel near the forms makes placing difficult, a layer of mortar of the same coment-sand ratios as used in concrete shall be first deposited to cover the surfaces.

#### 8. Curing

- General All concrete shall be moist cured for a period not less than seven (7) consecutive days by an approved method or combination applicable to local conditions.
- b. Moist Curing ~ The surface of the concrete shall be kept continuously wet by covering with burlap plastic or other approved materials thoroughly saturated with water and keeping the covering spraying or intermittent hosping.

#### 9. Finishing

- a. Concrete surfaces shall not be plastered unless otherwise indicated. Exposed concrete surfaces shall be formed with plywood, and after removal of forms, the surfaces shall be smooth, true to line and shall present or finished appearance except for minor defects which can be easily repaired with patching with cement mortar, or can be prounted to a smooth surface to remove all joint marks of the form works.
- Concrete States on Fig. The concrete states on fill shall be taid on a prepared foundation consisting of sub grade and granular fill with thickness equal to the thickness of the overlaying state except when indicated.

#### B. MOISTURE PROTECTION

#### 1. WATERPROOFING

- a. Comentificus waterproofing powder mix shall be coment-based, aggregate-type, heavy duty, waterproof coating for reinforced concrete surface and mesonry exposed to water. Additive binders shall be of special formulation of acrylic polymers and modifiers in liquid form used as additive with coment-based powder mix that improves achiesion and mechanical properties. Water shall be clean, clear and potable.
- b. Concrete surface to be applied with waterproofing shall be structurally sound, clean and free of dirt, loose morter particles, paint films, oil, protective coats, efficiescence, laitance, etc. All defects shall be properly corrected and carefully formed to provide a smooth surface that is free of marks and properly cured prior to application works.
- c. Furnish all labor, materials, equipment, plant and other facilities required to complete all waterproofing work as shown on the drawings and herein specified. All applications shall be strictly performed by an approved waterproofing Contractor.

Test waterproofed area by seventy-two (72) hours and check for any seepages.

Note: Thickness should be as per Manufacturer's Specifications and Installation depending on the areas to be applied with.

#### 2 VAPOR BARRIER

 Vapor barrier shall be placement of 8mil Polyethytene sheet prior to pouring of concrete for foundation members, stabs-on-fill and stabs-on-grade.

#### E. ARCHITECTURAL WORKS

#### A. FLOOR FINISHES

 Ceramic Titles. Unglazed caramic tites shall be hard, dense tites of homogeneous composition, its color and characteristics area determined by the materials used in the body. The method of menulacture and the thermal treatment.

Tile work shall not be started until roughing-ins for sanitary/plumbing, electrical and other trades have been completed and tested. The work of all other trades shall be protected from damage.

Vinyl Floor Tiles. Vinyl tiles shall be of first grade quality. Fully homogeneous, flexible, resilient, and resistant to alkeli moisture, graces and oil. The color and design pattern of the vinyl tile shall be uniformly distributed throughout the thickness of the tile. Vinyl tiles shall be 2mm thick.

Installation of the tile shall not commence until the work of other trades, including painting has been completed. The Contractor shall carefully examine all surfaces over which the tiles are to be set. Floor surfaces that are to receive vinyl tile shall be clear thoroughly, dry, smooth, firm and sound and free from oil, paint, winc, din and any other damaging material.

 Cernent Floor Finish. Morter topping shall be one part Portland cament and three parts fine aggregate by loose volume.

Finish topping shell be pure Portland cement properly graded, mixed with water to approved consistency and plasticity. Where required to be colored cement floor finish, red or green exide powder shall be premixed with Portland cement complying with finish topping requirements and the desired color intensity. Cement floor finish floor hardener shall be premixed as required and applied in accordance with the manufacturer's instruction menual.

 Pubble Washout Finish. Pebble shall be well graded stones sized ranging from #4 to #10 rounded specie.

All peoble washout finish shall be done by men experienced and qualified to do this particular type of trade. The Contractor shall submit at least two samples for each type of peoble washout finish to the Engineer/Architect for approval showing its color, texture and design patterns.

Pebble weathout finish mix shall consist of one part Portland cement and two parts pebble measured by volume or a proportion equivalent to 1.2. Mixtures shall be in approved containers to ensure that the specified materials are controlled and accurately measured. Mixtures measured by shovel or shovel counts will not be permitted, Unless specified otherwise pebble washout mix shall be in the proportion by volume in approved mixing mechines or mortar boxes. The appropriate introduced and mixed in such a manner that the materials will be uniformly distributed throughout the mass. A sufficient amount of water shall be added gradually and the mass further mixed until a mortar pleasicity recessary for the purpose intended is obtained. Mortar boxes, pens atc. where mixtures are mixed shall be keep clean and free from debris or dried mortar.

- 5. Granite Tiles

- 7. Anti-Microbial Tiles
- 8. Hardwood Tiles

## B. WALL FINISHES AND PARTITIONING

 Ceramic Tiles. Glazed titles and trims shall have an impervious facts of ceramic materials fused onto the body of the tites and mins. The glazed surface may be clear white or colored depending on the color scheme approved by the Engineer Standard glazes may be bright (glossy), semi-matte (less glossy), mails (dull) or crystalline (motited and textured; good resistance to ebrasion).

Title work shall not be started until roughing-ins for sanitary/plumbing, electrical and other trades have been completed and tested. The work of all other trades shall be protected from demage.

 Commit Fluster Finish. Mortar mixture for brown cost shall be freshly prepared and uniformly mixed in the proportion by volume of one part Portland cement, three (3) parts sand and one fourth (1/4) part hydrated lime.

Finish cost shall be pure Portland current properly graded conforming to the requirements and mixed with water to approved consistency and plasticity.

Double-Walt Fitter Commit Stated Drywall on Metal Study. Well panel shall be two.
 6 mm thick fiber coment boards, properly out and prepared for installation and shall conform to the requirements of the Plans.

Metal Studs. Wall freming shall consist of 0.6 mm thick aluminum metal stude and aluminum metal tracks.

Fasteners and Connection detail. All construction and connections shall be secured with divets, screws and drive pins, and shall conform to local and standard codes. Connections shall also be secured with gypsum pulty and gypsum tape.

#### Toilet Partition.

### C. CEILING FINISHES

- 1. Fiber Cement Board on Metal Frame. The ceiting materials to be used shall conform to the samples approved by the City Engineer. All ceiting works shall be done by men experienced and qualified to do this particular specialty trade. The installation of ceiting materials shall be in accordance with the detailed section and with the manufacturer's manual instructions. Ceiting materials shall be cut as required to fit the perpendicular condition and should be properly secured by anchorage and other accessories to complete the installation. No machanical work shall be exposed on the finish work. All joints around electrical outlets, pipes and other works extending through materials shall be seeded.
- 2. Molecure Resistant Gypsum Board on Metal Frame. The ceiling materials to be used shall conform to the samples approved by the City Engineer. All ceiling works shall be done by men experienced and qualified to do the particular specially trade. The installation of ceiling materials shall be in accordance with the detailed section and with the manufacturer's manual instructors. Cating materials shall be cut as required to fit the perpendicular condition and should be properly secured by anchorage and other accessories to complete the installation. No mechanical work shall be exposed on the finish work. All joints around electrical outlets, pipes and other works extending through materials shall be sealed with cauliting.
- 3. Gypsum Board on Metal Frame. The calling materials to be used shall conform to the samples approved by the City Engineer. All calling works shall be done by man expensioned and qualified to do this particular specially trade. The installation of calling materials shall be in accordance with the detailed section and with the manufacturar's manual instructions. Calling materials shall be out as required to fit the perpendicular condition and should be properly secured by anchorage and other accessories to complete the installation. No mechanical work shall be exposed on the finish work. All joints around electrical outlets, pipes and other works extending through materials shall be sealed with caulking.
- 4. Acoustic Board Celling on T-Runner Frame. The ceiting materials to be used shall conform to the samples approved by the City Engineer. All ceiting works shall be done by men experienced and qualified to do this particular specialty trade. The installation

of ceiting materials shall be in accordance with the detailed section and with the manufacturer's manufal instructions. Ceiting materials shall be cut as required to fit the perpendicular condition and should be properly secured by archorage and other accessories to complete the installation. No mechanical work shall be exposed on the finish work. All joints around electrical outlets, pipes and other works extending through materials shall be sealed with cautiting.

#### IV. SANITARY / PLUMBING WORKS

- A. Comply with the current applicable codes, ordinances, and regulations of the authority or authorities having junisdiction, the rules, regulations and requirements of the utility companies (as applicable).
- Supply, installation and testing of the following.
  - Potable water supply system complete in all respects including but not limited to submittals, shop drawings, piping, water meters, valves, bibbs, insulation, all accessories required for complete and operational of the system.
  - Water service connections including but not limited to water meters, float valves. Any and all other works involve in providing the complete operation of the water supply system.
  - Soil weste end vent system complete in all respect including but not limited to connection to existing sewer, submittels, shop drawings, pipes, fittings, valves, cleanout, drains, etc. Complete and operational.
  - 4 Storm dramage system complete in all respect including but not limited to connection to existing storm drainage, submittals, shop drawings, pipes, fittings, valves, cleanout, drains, etc. Complete and operational.
- C. Workmanship and installation methods shall conform to the best modern practice. Employ skilled tradesmen to perform work under the direct supprvision of fully qualified personnel.
- D. All equipment and installations shall meet or exceed minimum requirements of the Standards and Codes as specified in plans and program of work.
- E. Install equipment in strict accordance with menulacturers written recommendations.
- F. Physical sizes of all plant and equipment are to be suitable for the space ellocated for the account the requirement of access for maintenance purposes.
- G in selecting makes and types of equipment, the Contractor shall ascertain that facilities for proper maintenance, repair and replacement are provided.
- M. Where the Contractor proposes to use an item of equipment other than that specified or deteiled in the drawing, which requires any redesign of the system, drawings showing the layout of the equipment and such redesign as required therefore shall be prepared by the Contractor at his own expenses. Where such approved deviation necessitates a different quantity and arrangement of materials and equipment's from that originally specified or indicated in the drawings, the Contractor shall furnish and install any such additional materials and equipment's required by the system at no additional cost.
- Equipment catalogue and manufacturer's specifications must be submitted for examination and details shall be submitted for approval before any equipment is to be ordered.
- This shall include all Information necessary to ascertain the equipment comply with this
  specification and drawings. Data and sales catalogue of a general nature will not be
  accepted.
- K. All materials, equipment, components and accessories shall be delivered to the Site in a new condition, properly pecked and protected against demage or contamination or distortion, breekage or structural weakening due to handling, adverse weather or other

circumstances and, as far as practicable, they shall be kept in the packing cases or under approved protective coverings until required for use.

- Any items suffering from damage during manufacture, or in transit, or on site whitst in storage or during eraction shall be rejected and replaced without extra cost.
- M. All sankary fittings and pipework shall be cleaned after installation and keep them in a new condition.
- N. All installed pipelines shall be flushed through with water, rodded when necessary to ensure desirance of debris.
- Cleaning and flushing shall be carried out in sections as the installation becomes completed.
- P. The Contractor shall carry out hydrautic test on the complete plumbing systems and the drainage system to show that it is functioning satisfactority within the requirements of this Specification and local regulations.
- Q. The Contractor shall provide suitable test pumps and arrange for a supply of water required in connection with testing of pipework. The test pump shall be fitted with pressure gauges which shall be of suitable range for the pressure being applied.
- R. Hydrautic tests shall be certied out as the pipework is installed and shall be completed before chases in walls end ducts are closed. Also test shall be carried out prior to false ceilings and other finishes are installed.
- S. Testing apparatus shall be provided by the Contractor. Where any section of pipework or equipment is unable to withstand the maximum pipework test pressure, it shall be isolated during the pipework test then that section of pipework or equipment shall be re-tested at the appropriate test pressure.
- The Sanitary Contractor must carry out any additional tests required by the end-user and/or approving agency.
- U. Drainage pipe shall be tested by filling the pipe with 3m, of water higher than the test section and wast for 15 min, then check for leakage at every joints.
- V. Testing of drainage systems shall be carried out in sections by dividing the system horizontally. Each section shall comprise pipework and fitting for three floors/storeys required for testing.
- W. Drainage pressure pipe shall be hydraulic tested at minimum pressure 50 psi.
- X Hangers and supports for plumbing piping and equipment shall withstand the effects of gravity loads and stresses within limits and under conditions indicated according to ASCE/SEL7.
- Y. Install hangers and supports to allow controlled thermal and seismic movement of piping systems, to permit freedom of movement between pipe anchors, and to facilitate action of expansion joints, expansion loops, expansion bends, and similar units.
- Z Install learnal bracing with pipe hangers and supports to prevent sweying.
- AA, install building attachments within concrete slabs or attach to structural steel. Install additional attachments at concentrated loads, including valves, flanges, and strainers, NPS 2-1/2 (DN 65) and targer and at changes in direction of piping. Install concrete inserts before concrete is placed; featen inserts to forms and install reinforcing bars through openings at top of inserts.
- BB. Install hangers and supports so that piping live and dead loads and stresses from movement will not be imposmitted to connected equipment.
- CC. Install hangers and supports to provide indicated pipe slopes and to not exceed maximumpipe deflections allowed by ASME B31,9 for building services piping.
- V. ELECTRICAL WORKS

#### A. CONDUITS, BOXES AND FITTINGS

- This item shall consist of the furnishing and installation of the complete conduit work, consisting of electrical conduits; conduit boxes such as junction boxes, pull boxes, utility boxes, octagonal and square boxes; conduit fittings, such as couplings, locknuts and bushings and other electrical materials needed to complete the conduit roughingin work of this project.
- All materials shall be brand new and shall be of the approved type meeting all the requirements of the Philippine Electrical Code and bearing the Philippine Standard Agency (PSA) mark.
- All works throughout shall be executed in the best practice in a workmanifile manner by qualified and experienced electricians under the immediate supervision of a duly licensed Electrical Engineer.
- 4. The work to be done under this division of specifications consists of the fabrication, furnishing, delivery and installation, complete in all details of the electrical work, at the subject premises end all work materials incidental to the proper completion of the installation, except those portions of the work which are expressly stated to be done by other fields. All works shall be done in accordance with the rules and regulations and with the specifications.
- All lighting fixtures and lamps are as specified and listed on lighting fixture schedule.
- 6. All grounding system installation shall be executed in accordance with the approved plans. Grounding system shall include building perimeter ground wires, ground rods, clamps, connectors, ground wells and ground wire tape as shown in the approved design.
- 7. All auxiliary systems such as telephone and intercom system, time clock system, fire aterm system and public address/hurse's call/paging system installations shall be done in accordance with the approved design.
- Upon completion of the electrical construction work, the contractor shall provide all
  test equipment and personnel and to submit written copies of all test results.
- 9. The contractor shall guarantee the electrical installation are done and in accordance with the approved plans and specifications. The contractor shall guarantee that the electrical systems are free from all grounds and from all defective workmanship and materials and will remain so for a period of one year from date and acceptance of works. Any defect shall be remedied by the Contractor at his own expense.

#### B. WARES AND WIRING DEVICES

- This item shall consist of the furnishing and installation of all wires and wiring devices consisting of electric wires and cables, well switches, convenience receptacles, heavy duty receptacles and other devices shown on the approved Plane but not mentioned in these specifications
- 2. Wires and cables shall be of the approved type meeting all the requirements of the Philippine Electrical Code and bearing the Philippine Standard Agency (PSA) mark. Unless specified or indicated otherwise, all power and lighting conductors shall be insulated for 800 volts. All wires shall be copper, soil drawn and armedied, smooth and of cylindrical form and shall be centrally located inside the resulation.
- Conductors or wires shall not be drawn in conduits until after the coment plaster is dry and the conduits are thoroughly cleaned and free from dirt and moisture. In drawing wires into conduits, sufficient stack shall be allowed to petral easy connections for fodures, switches, receptacles and other wring devices without the use of additional aplices.
- All conductors of convenience outlets and lighting branch circuit homeruns shall be wred with a minimum of 3.5 mm in size. Circuit homerune to panelboards shall not be

smaller than 3.5 mm but all homeruns to penelboard more than 30 meters shall not be smaller than 5.5 mm. No conductor shall be less than 2 mm in size.

- 5. All wires of 14mm and larger in size shall be connected to panels and appearable by mesals of approved type lugs or connectors of the solderless type, sufficiently large enough to enclose all strands of the conductors and securely fastened. They shall not loosen under vibration or normal strain.
- 6. All joints, taps and splices on wires targer than 14 mm shall be made of suitable soldeness connectors of the approved type and size. They shall be taped with rubber and PVC tapes providing installation not less than that of the conductors.
- 7. No aptices or joints shall be permitted in either feeder or branch conductors except within outlet boxes or accessible junction boxes or pull boxes. All joints in brench circuit wining shall be made mechanically end electrically secured by approved splcing devices and taped with rubber and PVC tapes in a manner which will make their insulation as that of the conductor.
- 8. All wall switches and receptacles shall be fitted with standard Bakelite face plate covers. Device plates for flush mounting shall be installed with all four edges in continuous contact with finished wall surfaces without the use of coiled wire or similar devices. Plaster filling shall not be permitted. Plates installed in wet locations shall be casketed.
- 9 When more than one switch or device is indicated in a single location, gang plate shall be used.

#### C. POWER LOAD CENTER, SWITCHGEAR AND PANELBOARDS

- This item shall consist of the furnishing and installation of the power load center unit substation or low voltage switchgeer and distribution panelboards at the location shown or the approved Ptens complete with transformer, circuit breakers, cabinets and all accessones, completely wired and ready for service.
- 2 All materials shall be brand new and shall be of the approved type meeting all the requirements of the Philippine Electrical Code and bearing the Philippine Standard Agency (PSA) mark.
- 3. Power Load Center Unit Substation The Contractor shall furnish and install an indoortype Power Load Center Unit Substation at the location shown on the approved Plans if required, it shall be totally metal-anclosed, dead front and shall consist of the following coordinated component parts:
  - High Voltage Primary Section. High voltage primary incoming line section, consisting of the following parts and related accessories.
    - One (1) Air-filled Interrupter Switch, 2-position (open-close) installed in a suitable air filled metal enclosure and shall have sufficient interrupting capacity to carry the electrical load. It shall be provided with key interlock with the cubicle for the power fuses to prevent access to the fuses unless the switch is open.
    - ii. Three (3)-power fuses mounted in expense compartments within the switch housing and accessible by a hinged door.
    - One 1) set of high voltage potheside or 3-conductor cables or three single conductor cables.
    - iv Lightning arresters shall be installed at the high voltage cubide if required.
    - Rems (i) and (ii) above could be substituted with a power circuit breaker with the correct rating and capacity.
  - b. Transformer Section. The transformer section shall consist of a power transformer with ratings and capacities as shown on the plans. It shall be oil liquid-filled non-flammable type and designed in accordance with the latest applicable standards.

The transformer shall be provided with four (4) approximately 2 1/2 % rated KVA taps on the primary winding in most cases one (1) above and three (3) below rated primary voltage and shall be changed by means of externally gang-operated manual tap changer only when the transformer is de-energized. Tap changing under load is acceptable if transformer has been so designed.

The following accessories shall be provided with the transformer, namely: drain valve, sampling device, filling connection, oil liquid level gauge, ground ped, top filter press connection, lifting lugs, diagrammatic nameplate, relief valve, thermometer and other necessary related accessories.

The high-voltage and low-voltage bushings and transition flange shall be properly coordinated for field connection to the incoming line section and low voltage switchboard section, respectively.

- c. Low Voltage Switchboard Section. The low-voltage switchboard shall be standard modular-unitized units, metal-built, dead front, safety type construction and shall consist of the following:
  - i. Switchboard Housing. The housing shall be heavy gauge steel sheet dead front type, gray enamel finish complete with frame supports, steel bracings, steel sheet panelboards, removable rear plates, copper businers, and all other necessary accessories to insure sufficient mechanical strength and safety. It shall be provided with grounding botts and clamps.
  - ii. Secondary Metering Section. The secondary metering section shall consist of one (1) entimeter, AC, indicating type; one (1) voltmeter, AC, indicating type, one (1) arranger transfer switch for 3-phase; one (1) voltmeter transfer switch for 3-phase; and current transformers of suitable rating and capacity.

The above-mentioned instruments shall be installed in one compariment above the main breaker and shall be complete with all necessary accessories completely wired, ready for use.

Main Circuit Breaker. The main circuit breaker shall be draw-out type, manually or electrically operated as required with ratings and capacity as shown on the approved Plans.

The main breaker shall include insulated control switch if electrically operated, manual trip button, magnetic tripping devices, adjustable time overcurrent protection and instanteneous short circuit trip and all necessary accessories to insure sele and efficient operation.

iv. Feeder Circuit Breekers. There shall be as meny feeder breekers as are shown on the single line diagram or schematic riser diagram and schedule of loads and computations on the plans. The circuit breakers shall be drawout or molded case as required. The circuit breakers shall each have sufficient interrupting capacity and shall be maraually operated complete with trip devices and all necessary accessories to insure safe and efficient operation. The number, ratings, capacities of the feeder branch circuit breakers shall be as shown on the approved Plans.

Circuit breakers shall each he of the indicating type, providing 'ON' - "OFF and "TRIP" positions of the operating handles and shall each be provided with nameptate for branch circuit designation. The circuit breaker shall be so designed that an overload or short on one pole eulomatically causes all poles to open.

d. Low Voltage Switchgeer (For projects requiring low-voltage switchgeer only). The Contractor shall furrish and Install a low-voltage switchgeer at the location shown on the plens. It shall be ratel-cled, dead front, free standing, safety type construction and shall have copper busbars of sufficient size, braced to resist altowable root mean square (RMS) symmetrical short circuit stresses, and alt necessary accessories. The low-voltage switchgeer shall consist of the switchgeer housing, secondary metering, main breaker and feeder branch circuit.

e. Grounding System. All non-current carrying metallic parts like conduits, cabinets and equipment frames shall be properly grounded in accordance with the Philippine Electrical Code, latest edition.

The size of the ground rode and ground wires shall be as shown on the approved. Plans. The ground resistance shall not be more than 5 ohms.


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## SECOND FLOOR STRUCTURED CABLING LAYOUT

## Section VIII. Bill of Quantities

#### **Notes on the Bill of Quantities**

#### **Objectives**

The objectives of the Bill of Quantities are:

- a. to provide sufficient information on the quantities of Works to be performed to enable Bids to be prepared efficiently and accurately; and
- b. when a Contract has been entered into, to provide a priced Bill of Quantities for use in the periodic valuation of Works executed.

In order to attain these objectives, Works should be itemized in the Bill of Quantities in sufficient detail to distinguish between the different classes of Works, or between Works of the same nature carried out in different locations or in other circumstances which may give rise to different considerations of cost. Consistent with these requirements, the layout and content of the Bill of Quantities should be as simple and brief as possible.

#### **Daywork Schedule**

A Daywork Schedule should be included only if the probability of unforeseen work, outside the items included in the Bill of Quantities, is high. To facilitate checking by the Entity of the realism of rates quoted by the Bidders, the Daywork Schedule should normally comprise the following:

- a. A list of the various classes of labor, materials, and Constructional Plant for which basic daywork rates or prices are to be inserted by the Bidder, together with a statement of the conditions under which the Contractor will be paid for work executed on a daywork basis.
- b. Nominal quantities for each item of Daywork, to be priced by each Bidder at Daywork rates as Bid. The rate to be entered by the Bidder against each basic Daywork item should include the Contractor's profit, overheads, supervision, and other charges.

#### **Provisional Sums**

A general provision for physical contingencies (quantity overruns) may be made by including a provisional sum in the Summary Bill of Quantities. Similarly, a contingency allowance for possible price increases should be provided as a provisional sum in the Summary Bill of Quantities. The inclusion of such provisional sums often facilitates budgetary approval by avoiding the need to request periodic supplementary approvals as the future need arises. Where such provisional sums or contingency allowances are used, the SCC should state the manner in which they will be used, and under whose authority (usually the Procuring Entity's Representative's).

The estimated cost of specialized work to be carried out, or of special goods to be supplied, by other contractors should be indicated in the relevant part of the Bill of Quantities as a particular provisional sum with an appropriate brief description. A separate procurement procedure is normally carried out by the Procuring Entity to select such specialized contractors. To provide an element of competition among the Bidders in respect of any facilities, amenities, attendance, etc., to be provided by the successful Bidder as prime Contractor for the use and convenience of the specialist contractors, each related provisional sum should be followed by an item in the Bill of Quantities inviting the Bidder to quote a sum for such amenities, facilities, attendance, etc.

#### **Signature Box**

A signature box shall be added at the bottom of each page of the Bill of Quantities where the authorized representative of the Bidder shall affix his signature. Failure of the authorized representative to sign each and every page of the Bill of Quantities shall be a cause for rejection of his bid.

These Notes for Preparing a Bill of Quantities are intended only as information for the Procuring Entity or the person drafting the Bidding Documents. They should not be included in the final documents.
