RESOLUTION NO. SP- **9938**, S-2024

A RESOLUTION URGING ALL CONDOMINIUMS AND SUBDIVISIONS LOCATED WITHIN QUEZON CITY TO FULLY COOPERATE WITH THE PHILIPPINE STATISTICS AUTHORITY (PSA) AND THE BARANGAYS IN THE CONDUCT OF THE 2024 CENSUS OF POPULATION AND COMMUNITY-BASED MONITORING SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) will begin the simultaneous enumeration of households for the 2024 Census of Population (POPCEN) and the Community-based Monitoring System (CBMS) starting July 15, 2024;

WHEREAS, the conduct of the POPCEN and CBMS follows the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. aimed at enhancing the effectiveness and responsiveness of the government's anti-poverty and social protection program;

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WHEREAS, the simultaneous conduct of the activity specifically aims to: (1) update the inventory of the total population in all barangays, cities/municipalities, provinces and regions in the Country, (2) Update the list of beneficiaries of government social protection programs thereby reducing leakages, (3) update the distribution of shares of Local Government Units in the National Tax Allocation, (4) aid in the implementation of the recently signed Republic Act No. 11964, otherwise known as the "Automatic Income Classification of Local Government Units Act," and (5) aid in the efficient use of government resources;

WHEREAS, to ensure the success of the activity, full cooperation and support of all households is necessary, especially those located within condominiums and subdivisions in Quezon City;

WHEREAS, condominiums and subdivisions located within Quezon City are urged to fully cooperate in the conduct of the simultaneous 2024 POPCEN-CBMS, subject to security guidelines (i.e. letter to the administrator and/or homeowners association for the conduct of the activity; and valid government-issued identification cards to be shown by the data gatherers, and the like);

WHEREAS, all barangays are likewise enjoined to display the official 2024 POPCEN-CBMS banner and/or streamer in conspicuous places in their barangays and launch an information dissemination campaign to the residents thereat.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby urge, all condominiums and subdivisions located within Quezon City to fully cooperate with the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) and the barangays in the conduct of the 2024 Census of Population and Community-Based Monitoring System.

CONCLUSION


The above are the main reasons for
